## **Supplies List:**

- **Stamps**: Going Global (wood 140745, clear 140748
- Ink: Archival Stampin' Pad Basic Black (140931)
- Paper: Kraft Cardstock (133674): 5 ½" x 8 ½"; Corrugated Paper Kraft (138317): 4" x 5 ¼" and 2 ¾" x 1 6/16"; Going Places Designer Series Paper Stack (140581): 5" x 3 ¾"; Real Red Cardstock (102482) 3" x 1"
- Accessories: Stampin' Emboss powder Clear (109130); 1 Antique Brad (117273); Banners Framelits (132173) 2 5/8" x 1 ½"; Bone Folder (102300); Heat Tool (129053); Fast Fuse Adhesive (129026); Stampin' Dimensionals (104430); Big Shot Die-Cutting Machine (113439)

## **Instructions:**

- 1. Fold the Kraft Cardstock in half and crease well with a Bone Folder to make card base.
- 2. Use Fast Fuse Adhesive to attach the Kraft Corrugated Paper to the front of the card and then add the Black Globe paper on top.
- 3. Using Big Shot Machine, and the 2 5/8" Banner framelit, cut the Real Red Cardstock banner, and then stamp it with the "You Mean the World to Me" stamp. While the ink is still wet, sprinkle on Stampin' Emboss Clear Powder and use the Heat Tool to emboss.
- 4. Punch a tiny hole in the Real Red banner and add the Antique Brad.
- 5. Adhere the banner to the Kraft Corrugated Paper 2 ¾" piece and then cut the end of the Kraft piece to make a banner slightly larger than the Real Red banner.
- 6. Use Stampin' Dimensionals on the back of the banner and adhere to the front of the card.
