

Since the merry month of March has arrived I thought I'd make a cute little box that can be filled with gold foil covered chocolate coins—striking the mythical pot of gold. All you need to do is change colors and images to fit any special occasion: wedding, love, birthday, Halloween.



## **Supplies List:**

- Stamps: Watercolor Wash 138704); Work of Art (134111)
- Inks: Pear Pizzazz (131180), Old Olive (126953), and Mossy Meadow (133645) Classic Stamp Pads; Old Olive Stampin' Write Marker (100079)
- **Paper**: Pear Pizzazz (131201) 5-1/2" x 11"; Old Olive (100702) 2-9/16" x 2-1/4"; Whisper White (100730) 2-7/16" x 2-1/8"
- Accessories: Big Shot Die-Cutting Machine (113439); Extended Cutting Pads (113478);
  Hamburger Box Bigz XL (133724); Gold Sequin Trim (132983) 10 sequins; Pear Pizzazz 1/4"
  Cotton Ribbon (134562) 20"; Gold 1/8" Ribbon (134583) 20"; Stampin' Dimensionals (104430);
  Multipurpose Liquid Glue (110755); Fast Fuse Adhesive (129026)

## **Instructions:**

- 1. Using Pear Pizzazz Classic Ink, stamp the Watercolor Wash image onto the Whisper White piece of cardstock.
- 2. Using Old Olive Classic Ink, stamp three hearts, from the Work of Art stamp set, in the shape of a shamrock. TIP: stamp the middle heart first, followed by additional hearts on the left and the right. Draw a stem with the Old Olive Stampin' Marker.
- 3. Using Mossy Meadow Classic Ink, stamp the greeting, also from the Work of Art stamp set.
- 4. Attach the Whisper White stamped layer to the Old Olive layer. Place 4 Stampin' Dimensionals on the reverse side and set aside for now.
- 5. Using Pear Pizzazz cardstock, the Big Shot and the Hamburger Box Die, cut out only the box.
- 6. Crease all score lines. Using Multipurpose Liquid Glue, secure the six corners. You might check out Stampin' Up!'s You Tube video for a quick 'how to' for placement of the glue and the gussets. (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OWFSaD4uwHM). Bottom line, apply a few dots of Multipurpose Glue to the inside and outside triangles and then attach it to the inside of the box. Pinch securely to ensure the glued pieces stay in place. Having these corners secured makes shaping the box possible.
- 7. Shape the box and add your goodies to the inside. Secure with a piece (or two pieces for this box) of ribbon, tying the bow on the side.
- 8. Attached the stamped layer with the Stampin' Dimensionals.
- 9. Using Multipurpose Glue, randomly attach 7 sequins to the top of the box and 3 to the box front.
